

# The scoring system

*The wines in this show were judged according to a standard assessment system where Appearance, Nose and Palate are allocated a maximum of 3, 7 and 10 points respectively, making a total maximum point score of 20 for each wine. Scores nominated by the three judges are then added together to produce the overall score (maximum 60 points). Only medal winners are listed.*

*Medals are awarded based on the overall score, as per the schedule below.*

<i>Gold Medal</i>	<i>55.5 - 60.0</i>
<i>Silver Medal</i>	<i>51.0 - 55.4</i>
<i>Bronze Medal</i>	<i>46.5 - 50.9</i>
